






Windy Night with Wild Horses Word Box




Wild Horses Double Puzzle Answer Key

Points of the Takhi Horse

The **muzzle** of a horse includes a horse's mouth, lips, nose, nostrils, and chin. Since horses have tunnel vision, the muzzle also has whiskers to sense objects directly in front of them and to feel around while grazing.

The **mane** is the hair that extends down a horse's neck. It protects against weather and insects.

The **withers** of a horse is the point at the base of the neck before the back. When measuring a horse's height, you start at the withers and measure by the width of your hand, to the ground.

The **back** of a horse extends from the withers to the **croup**, also known as the rump, making a deep curve in the middle The back covers the vertebrae that help lift the horse's head.

The tail extends from the **dock**. The muscles and vertebrae move the tail.

The **tail** is the hair that extends from dock at the end of the horse.

The **fetlock** is the protruding joint at the base of the cannon leg bone that carries the horse's weight.

Horses do have toes but only one on each **hoof**, which is the thick covered, lower part of the horse's leg that carries its weight.

The **barrel** is the center section of the horse and covers the horse's ribcage.


The **carpus** is the horse's knee, made of several bones joined together.

A horse's **shoulder** runs from the withers to its elbow on both sides.

The horse's **neck** is a long section of vertebrae and muscles that connects the head to the rest of the body.
